Our Photoshop Elements 14 class is currently half way through the course. We have 26 club members participating, and it has been a rousing success.

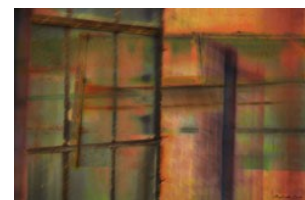
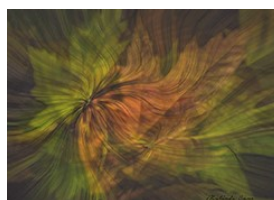
