Jim's presentation will include a discussion of technical skills to make outstanding images, such as ISO settings, shutter speed, aperture, and exposure compensation settings. Moreover, he will discuss the art of image making he utilizes in producing such exquisite and impactful images all of which tell an incredible and compelling story.

Lastly, Jim has agreed to conduct two field trips/workshops to Brookfield Zoo to coach and demonstrate his technique for capturing such wonderful images. One workshop will be conducted during the week and one workshop will be on the weekend in order to accommodate those who are unable to attend during the week.
